Opening of the Forum - November 12th, 19h

The Forum will open November 12th in a festive and active manner, simultaneously in Paris, Saint-Denis, Bobigny and Ivry-sur-Seine. The French and European delegates will thus find themselves together with local populations so as to encourage participation of the public in debates. A Brazilian personality will open the second European social forum by speaking of her experience at the World social forum in Porto Alegre. The mayors of each town will also give a welcoming speech.

The opening will begin at 19h in the following locations:

- Saint-Denis : place Jean Jaurès, métro Saint-Denis Basilique
- Bobigny : Jardins de la Mairie, métro Bobigny-Pablo Picasso
- Ivry-sur-Seine : The Venise Gosnat sports complex, rue Amédée Huon, métro Mairie d'Ivry

Protest-parade - November 15th, 14h

The Forum will end Saturday afternoon with a festive protest. The protest will be built in an artistic and activist form. It will be on the one hand a protest for the European social forum, but will unite diverse and active movements into one protest, which will celebrate them all.

Protest departs : Place de la République 14h

Route : République via Bastille by the boulevards du Temple and the Beaumarchais then to rue de Lyon, avenue Daumesnil, and boulevard Diderot.

Upon arrival at Nation around 18h, two floats will transform into open scenes on the place de la Nation.

An experimental and artistic creation workshop will be open at Ile Saint-Denis from the 8th to the 11th of November, Quai du Châteliers at l'Ile Saint-Denis, where the floats will be built. This is an opportunity for social movements, the public and artists to work together.

4- THE STAKES OF THE FORUM

The political stakes of the ESF 2003

Europe at the heart of the debates

The second European Social Forum (ESF) will reunite, during three days, representatives of more than 60 countries in 55 plenary sessions, 250 seminars, and hundreds of workshops.

After the success of the first European Social Forum in Florence, the issue was not only one of affirming the necessity of a democratic and pluralist Europe, of a Europe of citizens and peoples. The issue was also one of showing how this could be possible, and of sketching the roads and the means of realising it at the continental level.

Inscribing itself in the calendar of the year 2003 dominated by debates on the future of the European Union (enlargement from 15 to 25 members, extension of the work of the European Convention by the intergovernmental conference convened to elaborate a "constitutional treaty"), the ESF will be a privileged place and a moment for exchanges on a continental scale. At the heart of the debates: the Europe that the citizens want to build and live in.

In the framework of the Charter of principles of the World Social Forum of Porto Alegre, the ESF 2003 is organised completely independently – in relation to political parties as well as to official institutions – by social and citizens' movements, trade unions, associations, national as well as European.

Social and geographical enlargement

One of the objectives of the ESF 2003 is to guarantee participation by as large a number as possible of delegates from Central and Eastern Europe, as well as from southern countries. Broad popular involvement, of young people, working people, and specifically those working under precarious conditions, is another goal. Other voices will make themselves heard at the ESF, those that are normally excluded from the public debate, the people and the social actors that are hit the hardest by the liberal policies and the logic of security: the "withouts" ("les sans" in French), those without housing, without papers, without work etc, immigrants and those living in underprivileged areas.

In order to raise the financial means allowing for this participation, a solidarity fund has been created, using a "solidarity tax" of 10 % of the inscription fee of each delegate. A part of the general budget of the ESF also serves to assist, in an exceptional way, the arrival of non-European speakers that have not been able to raise the needed financial means in their countries or through international organisations.

The success of the Forum will really be dependent on a maximal involvement of citizens.

Accessibility for disabled persons

The year of 2003 having been declared the European year of the disabled, the associations of this sector have been making a particular effort since January in order to realise three objectives : maximal accessibility to the whole of the Forum for disabled persons (transports, specifically suited entrances, accompaniment), translation into sign language, and a transversal presence, as large as possible, of the theme of disability and of organisations of disabled people in the debates.

The cultural intervention

For the first time during a social forum, culture is one of the **central themes** of the program. Culture will have an important place in the axis 4 of the plenaries. It will also be the subject of numerous seminars and workshops.

In addition, the **program** aims at giving artists and artistic and cultural movements their role within social transformation. This program will favour the engagement of artists, the pluridisciplinarity of artistic practices (film, theatre, photography, poetry, painting, music,

installations, performances, etc), the emergence of new aesthetic forms and propositions, at the same time images of resistance to the politics of neoliberalism, and a preview of other worlds to come.

In the runup to the Forum, **residences for European artists** have been put into place in order to allow for the realisation of artistic creations specifically for the ESF and the involvement of the locals, and cultural and social actors.

During the Forum, short artistic interventions will take place in certain debates, in order to develop the forms of transmission and sharing of knowledge.

Finally, the ESF sets out to strengthen the cultural axis of the Forum by putting into place a **permanent space for dialogue, initiatives and actions** decided by the actors of this thematic area. This space, these dialogues, initiatives and actions are being constructed with cineastes, theatre people, artists, technicians and others wishing to take part.

The restitution of the debates

This year, the restitution of the debates is one of the priorities for the ESF. A large operational system for collecting and diffusing the propositions and decisions for action coming out of the debates in as close as possible to real time. The objective of this is to:

- prolong and enlarge the public space opened up by the ESF in terms of content of the interventions, proposals of alternatives, and proposals of citizen campaigning
- constitute and make permanent the memory of the ESF

The restitution is thus one of the dynamics within the process of the social forums, that favours the emergence of many different alternatives, reflecting the diversity of participants as well as of their ways of action. It allows for everyone the experience of being an actor and being part of a great movement of ideas and initiatives.

The result of the restitution will be accessible in particular on the Internet site of the ESF.

« Alternative » catering

In tune with the values of the ESF, associative caterers, cooperatives, farmers and shopkeepers will offer **products from organic agriculture, from fair trade, regional specialities**.

The structures put into place for catering respect social and environmental norms, and the prices of the caterers are non-profit, in order to **make an "alternative" catering available for all**.

Solidare housing

- **Collective housing:** gymnasiums, public spaces with showers and toilets, will be equipped to receive thousands (11 000 as of today) of French and European delegates. **Housing with a local :** all who have registered can request to be lodged by someone living in the Ile-de-France area.

Interpretation in six languages minimum, with volunteers all the way

Translation will be provided by the association Babels, an international network of engaged interpreters and translators, composed only of volunteers; professionals, students, interpreters or experienced amateurs. Interpretation will be provided mainly in five languages (German, English, Spanish, French, Italian) and also into sign language. Fifteen additional languages will also be functioning, depending on the language of the speaker: Albanian, Arabic, Bask, Catalan, Greek, Hungarian, Kurdish, Flemish, Polish, Portuguese, Rom, Russian, Serbo-Croatian, Swedish and Turkish.

This working structure is exceptional as much regarding the number and the geographical origins of the interpreters involved (more than one thousand interpreters coming from five continents), as regarding the number of languages translated. It's calling is to allow for a **real linguistic diversity** in the debates of the ESF.

Volunteers as the principal driving force of the organisation

The preparation of the ESF could not have been carried out without the essential contributions of the volunteers, who have put in working time valued way above what could be accounted for using the market terms promoted by the traditional economic system.

What is a social forum ?

From Porto Alegre to Paris/Saint-Denis/Bobigny/Ivry-sur-Seine

The World Social Forum (WSF) is a meeting place for organisations, movements or individuals that are opposed to neoliberalism and that are committed to building a society focused on human development.

It was organised for the first time in Porto Alegre (Brazil) in January 2001. The most recent one was held between the 23rd and 28th of January 2003, with over 100 000 participants, that is 3 times more people than for the first edition. The next WSF will take place in India between the 16th and 21st of January 2004.

A process of expansion and globalisation of the WSF started in 2002 at a **continental level** (African Social Forum in Mali, January 2002, and in Ethiopia, January 2003, Asian Social Forum, India, January 2003, Panamazonic Social Forum, Belem, Brazil, January 2002 and 2003, European Social Forum, Florence, November 2002), **national level** (in 30 countries) and even **local level**. In 2003, we are counting more than 100 local social forums in France. These allow for the multiplication of the force of the citizens' movement, and for people to search out and put into place alternatives at a local scale.

The social forums : spaces open to all the actors of society: individuals, associations, NGOs, trade unions etc.

According to the **Charter of principles of the World Social Forum** (see appendix), a social forum at any level aims to be *an open meeting place for reflective thinking, democratic debate of ideas, formulation of proposals, free exchange of experiences and interlinking for effective action, by groups and movements of civil society that are opposed to neoliberalism and to domination of the world by capital and any form of imperialism, and are committed to building a planetary society directed towards fruitful relationships among Humankind and between it and the Earth.*

The Forum is thus a meeting place for very different and sometimes opposite players, but its strength lies exactly in this will not to deny these differences, but to organise their confrontation, in order to make the debate move forward. In accordance with the principles of the Porto Alegre Charter, the Forum as such does not take stands, and there is no common statement and the end of a Forums.

Political parties are not directly involved in the organising or content of the meetings, but they can give their support. This rule is being applied in different ways according to national traditions.

The framework of the debates : plenaries, seminars and workshops

The program of the ESF is discussed and decided upon according to a participatory process, the first part of the sharing of ideas. All of the debates, with the exception of the workshops, are translated.

The **plenaries** are essentially moments of exchange and confrontation between the different forces involved in the process. The themes and the speakers are decided upon collectively by the European preparatory assembly. The political equilibrium and the diversity of the panels of speakers have been important criteria for the choices to be made.

The **seminars** are proposed and organised by European networks or in collaboration between several groups or associations from different European countries, and give opportunities to go

further into the themes of the plenaries. Their goal is to put forward alternatives to the present neoliberal system, as well as citizens' campaigns.

The **workshops** present practices, struggles and reflections of single organisations or groups of individuals. They are the reflections of the multiplicity of alternatives already in place or under construction.

As the project of the European constitution will open the public debate on the future of Europe, the program of the ESF wants to bring forward themes of discussion on the necessity and demands for another Europe. At this point, the issue is one of going further into the alternative responses that the alterglobalist movement might bring forward, to make visible common problems, and to reflect on possible mobilisations.

The organisation of the ESF 2003

More than 1500 European organisations taking part in the organisation of the ESF 2003

All decisions are taken by consensus on the European level by the **European Preparatory Assembly**, which reflects the multitude of actors: diversity of networks, of organisations, of national representation, not least of countries of Eastern Europe and the Balkans, and gender balance assured within the delegations. The EPA is an open structure, incorporating the entities and organisations that so wish. Today, there are more than 1500 organisations involved. They come together every three months.

The **French Initiative Committee** is the French instance that brings together the 250 organisations that have signed the organisational appeal (see list in appendix). It has stayed open so that organisations that were not present in the starting of the process have been able to associate themselves with it at a later point. Organisations that have not signed the appeal can be accepted as observers.

The **French Secretariat of Organisation** is in charge of all the tasks of preparation, of coordination (not least with the hosting towns) and of the material organisation of the ESF 2003. It works under the responsibility of the European Preparatory Assembly and tightly linked to the French Initiative Committee.

The **Financial Association for the ESF 2003** has as its only objective to collect the funds and use them according to the decisions made by the European Preparatory Assembly and the French Initiative Committee.

The partners of the European Social Forum 2003

Public authorities can also support the Forums, but neither they, nor the political parties, can intervene in their content. This has shown itself to be true in Porto Alegre, where the city and the state of Rio Grande do Sul have brought considerable material support, as well as in Italy where the city of Florence and the region of Tuscany largely funded the organisation of the first ESF.

According to the same logic of autonomy, the second ESF is already benefiting from the support of the cities of **Paris, Saint-Denis, Bobigny, and Ivry-sur-Seine**, as well as from the general councils of **Seine-Saint-Denis, Val-de-Marne** and **l'Essonne**. The French government has also decided to contribute financially to this reunion. We have also received support from **OXFAM – Novib** and from the **Agence intergouvernementale de la francophonie**. Unfortunately, the Région Ile-de-France backed down from its commitment to support the Forum, after an unfavourable vote by the councillors of the far right and the right, against the vote of the councillors of the left who were in favour of the project.
